As we move from the seasons of Easter into Pentecost and from spring into summer, you are invited to join us for worship in these ways:

✤ Or, if you're traveling and neither of those options work for you, or you can't make either the 8:30 or 11am services, look for our 8:30am service worship service archived on our website <u>connecttocentral.org</u>.

This is also the time of year when we typically wrap up our program year activities and shift into "summer mode." However, we are not slowing down. Rather, we will continue to ramp up as we (re)engage in Our Life Together. In fact, a new ministry team is launching which is described in detail on p. 5.

Here are just a few of ways you might consider being involved beyond Sunday morning worship:

- 1. A small group of people continue to provide a meal for First Place Families each Monday, year-round. Kim Meyers (541) 914-8442 can connect you with others who make this happen by: picking up food from the Eugene Mission on Fridays and delivering to the church; preparing and cooking the meal in the church kitchen or in your own home; delivering it to the Annex on Monday afternoon for their evening meal.
- 2. Our Community Garden on the corner of 18th and University will need to be harvested regularly over the summer months. Produce is given to the Student Food Pantry run by the Episcopal Campus Ministry housed at Grace Lutheran Church (18th and Hilyard). - 3. There are also a number of small projects that need attention around our church facility. Join Howard and Mason on Friday mornings for work projects outdoors or talk to Pastor Laurie about some areas inside that need to be decluttered and/ or reorganized throughout the facility.

NEWS FROM OREGON SYNOD ASSEMBLY (May 13-15)

All Resolutions and memorials passed, some as written, some as amended.

Resolutions (enacted within the Oregon Synod immediately)

Resolution on Formation of an Oregon Synod Antiracism Network

(sharing of resources of what churches have been doing in antiracism activities)

Resolution Regarding Type of Synod Assembly

(Online Synod Assembly two out of three years, meet in person on the third year to be coordinated with the election of the bishop)

2022 Inclusive Call Process Resolution

(Resolution looking to increase equity in the call process specifically for BIPOC Rostered Ministers)

Lift Every Voice Oregon Synod Resolution in Support of IP 17 and IP 18

(Support of two ballot initiatives to ban assault rifles)

Memorials (Sent to churchwide so that churchwide might make a resolution on this topic – no direct action in the Oregon Synod, but requests for churchwide assembly this summer)

Reparations and Land Return Memorial to the 2022 Churchwide Assembly of the ELCA (Asking churchwide to set a policy and plan for reparations)

Memorial Calling for a Just Transition to 50% Reduction in US Greenhouse Gas Emissions by 2030 (Asking churchwide to set a policy and plan for carbon neutrality)

Approval of 2023 Oregon Synod Budget

Central's Lay Delegates were: Chris Henry, Jill Liedtke, John Shurson. In addition, Rostered Leaders: Deacon Clare, Vicar Ben, Pastor Laurie and Synod Council Members: Becky Shurson and Clara Christensen (Youth Representative) were in attendance.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL

The Council met May 18, 2022 at 6:30pm via Zoom

Treasurer's Report (see last page of the Centralite)

At the recommendation from the Finance Committee a letter will be sent to the entire congregation explaining the current financial state of the church which will be sent from the President and Treasurer.

Planning for Semi-Annual Meeting:

Council planned for the Semi-annual meeting between services on June 5, 2022. The congregation will be voting on issuing a call to Ben Nickodemus to serve as Associate Pastor. The agenda includes electing new council members and next year's nominating committee, as well as updates on finances, Christus House/Campus Ministry, and property matters.

Action items:

Move to approve Personnel's recommendation of two peer ministers for positions at Christus House for the 2022-23 academic year. They are: Donia Abuelfetouch for Commitment & Integrity and Yulia Graham for Hospitality & Inclusion. These are funded through the CH Budget.

Move to approve Personnel's recommendation of hiring Beth Trower for the position of Video & Tech Support (live-streaming). Beth will serve as additional Tech Support and as a backup for Thomas Stine. This is funded by a grant from Endowment.

Move to approve Personnel's recommendation of hiring Kelly Colvin Smith as an Independent Contractor to update the database of the Central Lutheran membership in order to produce a new directory with pictures to be used by members only. This is funded by a grant from Endowment.

Move to approve Personnel's recommendation as amended to adjust the current Organist/Choirmaster's terms of employment to allow an additional month of paid leave beyond his accrued vacation of 20 days (4 weeks) per year. This will reduce annual compensation by 1/12. In 2022 this will be prorated from Jun-Dec with no change to the benefits package. (This came at ElRay's request so that he can spend more time traveling abroad. Lindsey will be compensated for worship services during this additional time off.)

Other Matters:

Pastor Laurie will be on vacation from May 25-Jun 1. She has been asked to officiate at a family member's wedding over Memorial Day weekend.
